TV AND RADIO BROADCASTING

Grace has been blessed with a TV and Radio Broadcasting License to continue preaching the gospel in Haiti. There is a Spiritual Revival taking place in Haiti. We are now broadcasting faith building teaching and music 24 hours a day, to strengthen God's beloved people of Haiti. Grace now has its first solar panel and an array of storage batteries which power Grace's new radio station, broadcasting God's word to Haiti.

Grace plans to purchase solar panels for both the Guest/Hospital building and the Girl's Home. Proposals have been received and we trust in God for the finances!

The solar panels cost \$500 a piece: batteries and installation are extra. Any contribution towards this project will be appreciated.

COMMUNITY EMPOWERING PROJECT



Grace's Haiti Empowerment Program, partnering with the American Red Cross, is helping 120 families from Lambi and Carrefour to become economically sustainable. Participants meet twice a week for five months and study how to successfully run a business. They also meet individually with their instructors for review and personal assistance. The first class of sixty participants will be graduating this August.

The remaining basecoat was applied in January by Christ Community Church from Camp Hill, PA, with Pastor Jeremiah Grube. Also, last Christmas, Renewed Strength Church with Pastor Mark from Ohio built a staircase.
